The State of West Virginia Fifty States project will organize a new statewide coordinating structure for advancing the National Spatial Data Infrastructure in West Virginia. The vision of the new coordinating structure is to have a broader representation that includes the private sector, academia, and all levels of government. It will strive to include high-level champions who understand geospatial technologies and funding issues in the form of elected officials or executive decision makers in the coordination process. The new coordinating body will develop the strategic and business plans necessary to leverage resources and minimize redundancies in the integration and publishing of standardized geospatial data from multiple sources. Lastly, it will seek formal political recognition, either through executive level or legislative action, and identify a source of sustainable funding from state government.

#### (2) Key Accomplishments:

The primary objective of organizing a new geospatial coordinating body, named the WV Association of Geospatial Professionals (WVAGP), was successfully completed.

- Coordination Meetings: There were a total of 4 organizational and 9 committee meetings to create WVAGP.
- o Coordination Business Plan: In August 2006, the GIS Coordination Committee completed a business plan recommending that a new GIS coordination body be formed.
- WVAGP Charter Meeting: On 15 March 2007, the WV Association of Geospatial Professionals approved its bylaws, elected officers, and enrolled new members.
- Nonprofit Designation: In August 2007, WVAGP was designated a 501(c)(3) nonprofit by the IRS.
- Website and Branding: In September 2007, WVAGP unveiled a new website (http://www.wvagp.org/) and logo.
- Formal Authorization: Since March 2007, the WVAGP leadership has met with the Governor's Office, Chief Technology Officer, and WV Legislative Joint Committee on Technology to inform high-level decision makers about the new association. In the near future WVAGP hopes to be formally recognized by executive order or statute.
- WVAGP Meetings: The WVAGP membership has held three regular membership meetings since being organized in March 2007 (see website for minutes). The 11-member board of directors which governs the association meets monthly.
- WVAGP Resolutions: In June 2007, WVAGP approved resolutions endorsing Imagery for the Nation and for NGS to publish WV State Plane Coordinates in feet.

# (3) Next Steps:

- Two immediate goals of the new association are to organize a successful GIS conference in June 2008 and to adopt a State GIS Plan.
- Other goals include formal recognition by the State, clearly identifying relationships between WVAGP and other GIS organizational elements in the State, and identifying and paying for administration support for WVAGP.

## (4) Helpful Assistance from CAP Program:

- Financial Assistance: The new association would not have formed without the financial assistance from FGDC / USGS. The funding has been instrumental in paying for the following expenses:
  - Meeting expenses
  - o Parliamentarian fees for drafting bylaws
  - Legal fees to attain nonprofit status
  - Website development
  - o Branding / graphics development
- Resources: The Fifty States Initiative resources were very informative, specifically:
  - o GIS Governance: Models and Best Practices (Lea Shanley)
  - o NSGIC Fifty States March 6 Newsletter (Bill Burgess)
  - NSGIC post cards and GIS treasure map


