### **Training Audience**

- Trainings will target regional councils across the country – NARC members and nonmembers
  - "Regional Councils" include metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs), councils of government (COGs), economic development districts (EDDs) and many other kinds of regional planning organizations.
- GIS is important in regional councils' work
  - They use GIS to create their transportation, environmental, homeland security, and economic and community development plans.
  - Metadata and the ability to share information across jurisdictional boundaries are essential.





## **Training Approach**

- An overview of the training session will be presented at the NARC's 44<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference and Exhibition in Cleveland, OH in June 2010.
- The technical training will be a three-part webinar consisting of lectures and hands-on exercises.
- There will be time after the webinar for ESRI to answer follow-up questions and provide additional guidance.





#### **Technical Approach**

- Participants will be shown how to create metadata using the ArcGIS Server Geoportal Extension web-based Metadata Editor.
- Participants will be able to take the metadata that they create and publish it to Geospatial One-Stop (GOS).
  - Participants will use their real content for the exercises, therefore adding new and relevant content to GOS.
- Trainees will also be shown how to discover geospatial services within GOS.
- Participants will be exposed to the FGDC service status checker to assess the service availability.





#### **Expected Impacts**

- NARC anticipates that it will reach a variety of regional councils, with varying GIS capabilities.
- Post-training support will be available from ESRI and NARC to assist trainees in implementing their new skills at their regional councils.
- Information and materials from the sessions will be posted to NARC's website, so the training content will not be limited to those who could attend the webinars and/or conference session.
