#### Welcome & Introductions, Camille Touton, DOI, FGDC Chair

Camille Touton, Deputy Assistant Secretary for Water and Science, DOI and FGDC Chair welcomed members and attendees to the meeting. She noted that it was her first meeting as chair and briefly discussed her new role. Participant's introductions were made. Ms. Touton provided an overview of the agenda and called for the approval of the minutes from the June Steering Committee meeting.

**DECISION:** The Steering Committee approved the minutes from the June Steering Committee meeting.

#### FGDC Business Activities, Ivan DeLoatch, FGDC OS

Ivan DeLoatch provided an update on FGDC activities.

<u>FGDC 2016 Annual Report</u>: The theme for 2016 Annual Report is "Recognizing Successes and Planning for the Future". The intent is to highlight FGDC's accomplishments for the new administration. The due date to provide content is September 28<sup>th</sup>. The plan is to have a pdf version by mid-December and printed copies by January 2017.

<u>2017 NGAC Appointments Update</u>: There are 15 current appointments expiring on December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2016. The appointment process is expected to be completed in January 2017.

<u>2016 Geospatial Platform Workshop</u>: A workshop is scheduled for December 7-8 at the South Interior Auditorium. The workshop is sponsored by the GeoPlatform Managing Partner in conjunction with FGDC and NGA. The purpose of the workshop is to present the Geospatial Platform implementation and share GeoPlatform.gov functional capabilities.

<u>2016 FGDC Meetings Summary</u>: The Executive Committee met on September 22<sup>nd</sup>, and will meet again on October 27<sup>th</sup> to discuss the Strategic Planning, transition strategy, and other FGDC business items.

<u>Federal Parcel Data Workshop</u>: The workshop was held on September 20<sup>th</sup> at the Homeland Security Acquisition Institute. Federal user cases for a National Parcels Database were examined. There were also discussions about needed attributes and touch points to other NSDI initiatives such as the National Address Database (NAD).

#### NSDI Strategic Plan Framework Dialog, Ivan DeLoatch, FGDC OS; John Mahoney, FGDC

John Mahoney provided an overview of the National Spatial Data Infrastructure (NSDI) Strategic Framework planning process.

Mr. Mahoney provided a summary of the NSDI Strategic Plan feedback that was received as the result of the various outreach activities to obtain input for the document. Steering Committee members were asked to provide comments on the feedback received.

Mr. Mahoney reported the feedback received from the NGAC during the NSDI Strategic Plan framework session. Some of the common themes in these comments included the following:

- Consider rebranding the NSDI to help convey its value
- Consider new organization approaches for leadership of national geospatial programs.
- Increase focus on users and consumers of geospatial information.
- Focus on engagement with partners.

The Steering Committee members engaged in a discussion based on the following question: What goals, priorities, or opportunities would you like to see included in the new NSDI strategic plan?

#### Steering Committee comments:

- The emergency management domain has limited knowledge about the NSDI.
- Emphasize national focus. The NSDI needs to be more than just federal component. How do we accomplish this?
- Role of federal government moving into the future. Reevaluate not just rebrand.
- Rebranding is a must and adding value services. What is the unique role of the NSDI?
- What is missing? What is needed? To have the NSDI be relevant?
- Characterize our role (spatial component) as part of the national data integration.
- Recognize spatial data as a critical component.

ACTION: Steering Committee members are asked to provide comments on the NSDI Strategic Framework summary feedback received.

#### National Address Database (NAD), Tim Trainor, DOC; Steve Lewis, DOT

Tim Trainor (DOC, US Census Bureau) reported that the Steering Committee approved the establishment of the Address Theme. The Department of Transportation (DOT) and Department of Commerce (DOC) are the Co-Leads of the Address Theme.

A subcommittee is in its initial creation and will be co-chaired by DOT and the U.S. Census Bureau. There is a draft charter in development. The Address Theme leads and subcommittee chairs are being identified. The subcommittee membership proposal is under review and will include federal agencies, partners, and non-federal organizations.

Steve Lewis (DOT) reported on the status of National Address Database (NAD). The NAD pilot Version 1.0 is complete, and it includes Arizona, Arkansas, and Boone County, Missouri. The NAD pilot final report is now available. To assist the states and counties without address data, a Crowdsource App Challenge will be launched to collect address data. #### NGAC Meeting Summary, Julie Sweetkind-Singer, NGAC Chair

Julie Sweetkind-Singer reported on the outcomes of the recent NGAC meeting of September 27-28 in Shepherdstown, WV.

The NGAC subcommittees reported on the status of their assignments. They also discussed transition planning activities. Some of the key recommendations included:

- Emphasize how geospatial information and technology helps achieve Administration priorities.
- Focus on support for effective decision-making.
- Focus on value of outcomes to citizens.
- Identify key messages.
- Use analogies & use cases to demonstrate impact.
- Focus on key program areas/priorities (jobs, homeland security, emergency response, health, etc).

NGAC members also discussed the NSDI Strategic Framework and provided ideas and recommendations for consideration. Their feedback included the following:

- Consider re-visioning or rebranding the NSDI.
- Consider new organizational approaches for leadership of national geospatial programs.
- Increase focus on users and consumers of geospatial information.
- Focus on engagement with partners & stakeholders, not just outreach.
- Continue progress on key initiatives.

The NGAC meeting also included several lighting talks' sessions of interest to the geospatial community.

As a next step, the NGAC will develop a draft transition recommendation paper. The subcommittees will revise their draft papers based on NGAC feedback, and prepare their final products by December.

The text NGAC meeting will be held via webinar on December 14 (tentative date).

#### NGDA Water - Oceans and Coasts (W-O&C)Theme Report, Tony LaVoi, NOAA

Tony LaVoi, Water, Oceans and Coast (W-O&C) Theme Lead reported on theme activities. He highlighted that the U.S. is an ocean nation, and that healthy coasts is critical to the nation's vitality.

Mr. LaVoi spoke about the coastal and ocean economies and noted the following drivers for a coastal and marine national spatial data infrastructure:

- Large geographic area with unique challenges and opportunities.
- Increasing population in the coastal zone.
- Critical contributions to the U.S. economy.
- Growing marine and coastal ecosystem impacts from development pressures.
- High-risk communities on the front-lines of climate impact and resilience planning.
- Strong national and international policy interests.

Mr. LaVoi noted that the W-O&C Theme Executive Champion is Zack Goldstein (NOAA). The theme is supported by the FGDC Marine and Coastal Spatial Data subcommittee. They were 25 NGDAs selected for initial theme population. The metadata for datasets are verified and posted in the Geospatial Platform. The Theme Strategic Plan has been completed, and the Theme Implementation Plan is in progress.

Mr. LaVoi discussed the challenges and opportunities within the theme and noted the following next steps:

- Develop W-O&C Implementation Plan.
- Ensure all NGDAs have appropriate mapping services.
- Host Special Interest meeting at Coastal GeoTools Conference.
- IWG-OCM beginnings work on National Ocean Mapping Strategy V2.

## Geospatial Platform, Tod Dabolt, DOI

Tod Dabolt provided a status update on the ongoing development of the Geospatial Platform. The accomplishments for the past 18 months towards high-performance web services included:

- Building out core services for SaaS/PaaS.
- Building better tools for managing assets.
- Laying foundations for secure, reliable, scalable, hardened services in the Cloud.
- Starting to make it easier for people to find the right resources for the right task.
- Building and testing core services for developers to access platform for open data and open services.

Mr. Dabolt illustrated and discussed the following new features on geoplatform.gov

- New Look and feel
- Additional map viewer functionality.
- Create and import maps from Esri's ArcGIS Online.
- Create and embed Map Galleries into external sites.
- Portfolio management capabilities to measure and manage national geospatial data assets.
- Enriched geospatial marketplace.
- Secure scalable Amazon Web Services cloud infrastructure.

Mr. Dabolt reported that there will be tools in upcoming releases such as a metadata tool.

#### USDA Data Management Policy Approach, Ted Payne, USDA

Ted Payne talked about geospatial initiatives in the Department of Agriculture (USDA) and discussed the new departmental regulation on geospatial management.

The new departmental regulation establishes data management, investment reporting, and a service approach as a foundational way of conducting business. Mr. Payne sated that USDA encourages other agencies to use a similar approach. Mr. Payne highlighted that the geospatial community should focus on data content distribution in addition to managing the data. The goal should be to mature content management and distribution.

Meeting Wrap Up, and Doug D. Nebert NSDI Champion of the Year Award Camille Touton, DOI,

Ms. Camille Touton reviewed actions, and noted that the meeting will conclude with the 2016 Doug D. Nebert NSDI Champion of the Year Award recognition.

The FGDC established this award in memory of a respected colleague, Doug Nebert, who was a recognized national and international leader in the establishment of Spatial Data Infrastructures. The award recognizes exemplary technical achievement and leadership in supporting the development and advancement of the NSDI. Doug's family members, Myrna and Robert Bernstein were also in attendance.

Ms. Camille Touton, Ivan DeLoatch (FGDC) and Kevin Gallagher (USGS) presented the Doug D. Nebert Award to the Oak Ridge National Laboratory Distributed Active Archive Center (ORNL DAAC) MODIS team. On behalf of the team, the recipients of the award were Suresh Kumar, Makhan Virdi, and Robert Cook.

The ORNL DAAC MODIS team is recognized by the FGDC as an early pioneer in remote sensing-based Spatial Data Infrastructures. The ORNL DACC MODIS system and tools exemplify the NSDI framework of the FGDC by following data and architecture principles as defined in OMB Circular A-16, implementation of FGDC endorsed standards and metadata guidelines, and adoption and delivery of National Geospatial Data Assets in accordance with the framework.
